6. **What two patterns can we see in the order of the metals?**

Bible Text – Daniel 2:31-35

7. **Who does the head of gold represent?**

Bible Text – Daniel 2:36-38

8. **Which kingdom does the chest and arms of silver represent?**

Bible Text – Daniel 2:39; Daniel 5:30-31

9. **Which kingdom does the belly and thighs of brass represent??**

Bible Text – Daniel 2:39; Daniel 8:20-21

10. **Which kingdom does the legs of iron represent?**

Bible Text – Daniel 2:40; Isaiah 53:5; Luke 2:1

11. **Which kingdom does the feet of iron and clay represent??**

Bible Text – Daniel 2:41-43; Jeremiah 18:6; Isaiah 64:8

12. What does the stone represent?

Bible Text – Daniel 2:44-45
